

Pan Am inaugural Douglas DC4 flight of FAM 19, San Francisco to Sydney via Honolulu. Canton Island Nadi (25February) and Noumea.

Backstamped Sydney 26 February. First flight covers from Fiji postmarked Lautoka 25 February 1947, pictorial cachet in black applied Return flight Delayed to 7November 1947 due to conflict with Australian Government over Reciprocal flying rights across the Pacific into U.S.A.



The first regular airmail service between Suva, Fiji and Funafuti in the Gilbert & Ellice Islands commenced on July 5th, 1964. It was operated by Fiji Airways Limited using a Heron aircraft. For a passenger the cost of the flight was 84-00.
