
Airgraphs from Phillips: (Roy)

Roy has sent in a 6 page display of Airgraph covers from Philips of Newport.


Phillips Airmail Covers Newport Monmouthshire AIRGRAPHS Canada to Newport Mon. February 1943 The Airgraph was invented in the 1930s by Phillips 12 Eastman Kodak in conjunction with Rin - Mail-Specializi Imperial Airways (now British Airways) NEW PORT. - Max Engla and Pan American Airways as a means of reducing weight and bulk of mails. The airgraph forms, upon which the letter is written is photographed and then sent as negatives on rolls of microfilm. 1600 negatives weighs 5ozs whilst 1600 hellips letters weigh 50lbs a huge saving. 2 t Ca orarou A Letter to A.Phillips Airmail Dealer Newport Mon. Airgraph services were extended to Canada and Burma in 1941. The service was not rationed and its postage was set at 3d..



As many of you know I have a small collection of stamps which have "Bristol" printed on them and this is a new addition showing the Bristol Beaufighter which suffered heavy losses in Operation "Black Friday" during WWII.



Bristol stamps (Aircraft)

These miniature sheets are from Sao Tome e Principe and commemorate "Black Friday". On 9 February 1945, a force of Allied Bristol Beaufighter aircraft suffered many losses during an attack on the German destroyer 233 and its escorting vessels; the operation was called "Black Friday" by the Allied survivors. The German ships were sheltering in a strong defensive position in Førde Fjord, Norway, forcing the Allied aircraft to attack through massed anti-aircraft fire. The Beaufighters and their escort of Mustang Mk III fighters from 65 Squadron RAF were intercepted by twelve Focke-Wulf Fw 190s of Jagdgeschwader 5 (Fighter Wing 5) of the Luftwaffe. The Allies damaged at least two of the German ships for the loss of seven Beaufighters shot down by flak guns. Two Beaufighters and a Mustang were shot down by the Fw 190s and four or five of the German planes were shot down by the Allied aircraft, including that of German ace Rudi Linz, Cat: 8734/8.
