

A new addition to my Chepstow postal history collection. A pre-stamp cover sent in 1829 and the first year of issue of this postmark.



Chepstow Postmarks (1829)

An entire "wrapper" letter posted from Robert Evans, solicitor, of Chepstow to a firm of solicitors in Cardiff on 22nd May 1829. The letter has been endorsed with a rate of 1/2 (1s and 2d?) in manuscript. A light red Chepstow circular mileage removed handstamp. This was used from 1829 – 1834, so this is in the first year of use. Contents are shown overleaf and refer to an affidavit of serving notices and the request of payment of the solicitor charges involved.
