Roy returned again, in April, this time with his stock to give members a chance for a good rummage. The visit from Nailsea saw David Pye, Dave Butterworth and Andrew Round displaying Scout Stamps, Eiffel Tower and South Africa Bantams.

One again there were few entries for the annual competition but sufficient to award firsts to Neil Jones for New Zealand Newspaper Stamps (General), Bev Davies for Prominent Women on GB stamps (Thematic) and Margaret Harding for GB Perfins (GB). Neil Jones also entered an eight sheet display of New Zealand Postage Dues.

The auction night raised £129.50 with 10% going to club funds and members donating £37.23 from sold lots to Cancer Research Wales.

The visit from Bridgend saw Reg Lyon displaying items from his service career, Nigel McGaw showing the first airmail service to Kirkwall and Brian Brandon displaying blocks of stamps.

As an innovation we had a club lunch in February instead of an evening Christmas meal. There was a good turn out at the Castle Inn in Caldicot.

Since the previous newsletter we have made visits to Barry and Cardiff clubs. Also Alistair Mackinnon visited Barry on 27 February with his display of "A Holiday in South Africa".


Welsh Philatelic Society (WPS)

A new find for me was a cover dated 25 October 1978 from Monmouth celebrating the battle of Agincourt. The connection here that Henry V was born in Monmouth Castle.

The Newport Scouts produced a strip of 10 stamps for local Christmas deliveries in December 2011.




Henry V • 1413-1422

 Born at Monmouth – August 9, 1387
 Succeeded as King – March 20, 1413
 Coronation – April 9, 1413
 Died at age 35 – August 31, 1422
 postmark: Battle of Agincourt




In January 2012, Magor Post Office lost one of its counter stamps and used Equipment Team Temporary 31 for a few days. This hand-stamp had been used previously at Pant. The replacement hand stamp differed for the previous ones moving Magor from Newport Gwent to Caldicot Mon.




Both the lost and the other hand stamp were replaced, resulting in two new postmarks (L and N)

There was no special cover or postmark to commemorate the event but when it was known that Robin Herbert, great grandson of Lady Llanover, would be speaking at the event, it was a chance too good to be missed. Panteg being the nearest post office to the event, a quick visit with some prepared covers resulted in a hand-stamp for the day and Robin Herbert was also pleased to sign the covers.
